



The Unstoppable Tugging

Today I'm sitting in our front room at home with our dog. *Jimma* is a ten month old American Bulldog mixed with Mastiff. She is a typical puppy. She loves to play and chew. She is house broken but loves to chew on just about everything she can get her teeth on. I've found plastic bottles, cardboard, drip lines, and even clay pots spread out all over the back lawn. She is very active.

But at this particular moment she is sitting motionless and staring at something. Her tail is slowly wagging back and forth, but the rest of her body is still and focused. As I lean over to see what has her undivided attention I chuckle. *Jimma* is transfixed once again on our cat *Feisty*. They are staring at each other and hyper sensitive to the other's every move. Over the past four months they have learned to co-exist, if you want to call their relationship 'co-existing'. They have only walked within three feet of each other a couple of times, and each time it ended in hissing and growling. *Jimma* even has a few scratches on the end of her nose given to her by *Feisty*. Our cat is proud of the battle scars she has dealt out.

Yet here's *Jimma*, once again, drawn to *Feisty*; moving ever so slowly toward her. She is trying to attack before the cat notices or I call her off. Just so

you understand, we have scolded *Jimma* and told her to back off a hundred times. Each time she obeys and walks away. But sure enough, within a few minutes, *Jimma* is back at it, sitting motionless, transfixed on her archenemy. She must know by now that confronting the cat only leads to bad endings. She bears the scars of previous attempts. But here she is again, frozen in a stare down, tail wagging.

It reminds me of our sin nature. We're constantly drawn to sin. There is something inside us that pulls us into thoughts that are not God's thoughts; into attitudes that are not His attitudes; or into actions that do not reflect His character. We know better than to tangle with that stuff. We even have some scars to remind us to stay away. But here we are again, transfixed on the temptations we face in this life. Just like my dog, we return time after time, thinking that this time we will not get scratched or hurt. Even though we know better, and want better, we're drawn in and captivated. Sometimes, without even knowing it, we've once again become in-

trigued with something that is not healthy or Godly.

I'm reminded of what the Apostle Paul shared about his personal struggle in life. In Romans 7:15 & 19-20 he says, 'For that which I am doing I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate.' And 'For the good I wish, I do not do; but I practice the very evil that I do not wish. But if I am doing the very thing I do not wish, I am no longer the one doing it, but sin which dwells in me.'

Just as there is something in *Jimma* that compels her to pursue the cat there is something in us that compels us to pursue thoughts, attitudes, or actions that are not part of the plan God has for us. This internal conflict that causes my puppy to chase the cat, even to her own demise, is similar to our internal compulsion (sin nature) that tugs on us to run after things that, in the end, will only hurt us.

What's Up Next?

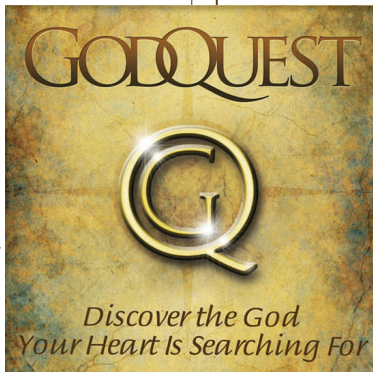

Something to Consider...

And let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds.

(Heb. 10:24)

Did you ever know that was in the Bible? Let us give attention on *how* we might stimulate our brothers and sisters in the family of God. It isn't just a suggestion, an off-the-cuff, casual ideal like, "Oh, by the way, it might look good, while you're holding fast to the faith, to toss in a little encouragement."

But he's not through with the thought. *Not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.* (v. 25)

It is impossible to stimulate someone else to love and good deeds if we are not around them. Encouragement is a face-to-face thing.

So, in effect, he says: *And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.* (v. 25 NLT)

I see a couple of thoughts woven through these lines.

Encouragement is not the responsibility of a gifted few, but the responsibility of the family of God. Obviously, the official role of a pastor is the responsibility of a few. And the role of an elder or deacon is another responsibility for a few. Maybe an officer or a teacher is the responsibility of a few people in a church. But I don't find this passage addressed to any specific, gifted individual, rather to all in the family. That means you.

Encouragement is not something that is needed less in the body, but more. You'll notice that the writer refers to this being needed "all the more as you see the day [of Christ's return] drawing near."

Do you know why? "In the last days perilous times shall come" (2 Timothy 3:1 KJV).

Interesting word that Paul uses, translated "perilous" in the King James Version. "Troublesome" is the paraphrase that some will use. It is also like our English term *savage*. "In the last days, savage times will come." These are the days in which we live.

Now why do I emphasize that? Because that's the reason we need encouragement all the more. When we walk out of the loving fellowship of God's family, we move into "savage territory." In that realm we can be easily intimidated. In light of that fact, God's people need to turn on the encouragement! The family of God is not a place for verbal putdowns, sarcastic jabs, critical comment, and harsh judgments. We get enough of that from the world. This is a place we need to assemble for the purpose of being encouraged . . . and we are free to be ourselves.

What is Biblical Love?

Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own, is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never fails; but if there are gifts of prophecy, they will be done away; if there are tongues, they will cease; if there is knowledge, it will be done away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part; but when the perfect comes, the partial will be done away. When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as I also have been fully known. But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.

1 Corinthians 13:4-13

Paul reminds us in the rest of the chapter (Romans 7) that Jesus sets us free from being a slave to such compulsions. We can now gain victory over the battle that rages within. We may never be free from the temptations, but we are free to use the power and strength of the Holy Spirit to gain victory. In short, I don't **have** to live like my dog; a slave to those inner tugging and temptations. *Jimma* has no internal power to keep her away from *Feisty*. Only my rebuke or a few more scratches will persuade her to give the cat more space.

But until she learns that lesson, here she sits, staring, waiting, hoping for a moment she can jump in and get a quick nip or swipe in. *Feisty*, although old, is an outside cat and knows all the tricks of combat. *Jimma* has no chance of defeating her. We, in the same way, know better than to play around with sinful temptations. We know it's best to steer completely clear of them. But there is just something inside us that won't let us go the other way. We have to learn to use



the power of God to stay clear of such temptations.

But right now I need to get up and put the dog outside where she will be safer. *Feisty* wins every time.
